This features the nation's most advanced hospital and the SA Health and Medical Research Institute, which will house Australia's only proton-therapy unit. The National Disability Insurance Scheme is a major social reform, and will also create approximately 6,000 jobs in our State

#### **PUBLIC TRANSPORT**

Show your JOBEX e-ticket to receive FREE Adelaide Metro public transport (train, tram and bus) on 10 and 11 November 2017.

The Adelaide Railway Station is conveniently located a short 2 minute walk from the Adelaide Convention Centre, and the tram stop is just in front of the Railway Station with many buses stopping nearby.

Taxis operate in the Adelaide metropolitan area and ranks are located on North Terrace and Morphett Bridge, right on the doorstep of the Central and West Buildings.

The free City Connector bus is an easy way of navigating around Adelaide; look out for bus 98C or 98A.

Adelaide is great to tour by bike as well. The Adelaide Convention Centre is a designated pick up and drop off point for Adelaide Free Bikes – an initiative run by the Adelaide City Council.

#### PARKING

If you are driving to the Adelaide Convention Centre, there are two undercover car parking options with the North Terrace and the Riverbank car parks.

Both are located directly under the Adelaide Convention Centre and are open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Clearance is 2.0 metres and automated payment stations accept credit/debit cards (1.5% surcharge for Visa, Mastercard, Diners and Amex). Both car parks are fitted with video surveillance camera systems and security patrols these areas.

#### **DISABILITY ACCESS**

Access and facilities for people with disabilities are provided throughout the Centre. All car parks and buildings are wheelchair accessible.

Due to the redevelopment construction works, some parts of the carparks are harder to access at the moment – we recommend using the North Terrace carpark rather than Riverbank, as North Terrace has disability parking close to the exit and the lifts. Maximum height is 2.0 meters.
