The most exciting feature is the new **Pridham Hall** it provides purpose-built facilities for students to celebrate University life, milestones and achievements. It is a one-stop shop for students and the local community, featuring a sports complex, swimming pool and facilities for graduations and corporate and cultural events.

The first graduation ceremony was held in Pridham Hall on Monday 9 April, where over 4,000 students graduated for the

The new University of South Australia Cancer Research Institute opened in 2018, and is an integral part of Adelaide's BioMed City on North Terrace, opening up a number of new cancer research, teaching and community engagement opportunities, pharmacy teaching, the community focused MOD and the Innovation & Collaboration Centre.

Level 1 of the Yungondi building is home to the State's first **simulated financial trading room**, enabling students, researchers and industry to engage with the global derivatives trading industry through market simulation programs. The simulated trading room runs 15 mins behind world trading time, ensuring current market changes and trends can be observed.



The trading room is sponsored by global leader in innovative technologies for the financial sector, IRESS, in an exciting new partnership for UniSA.

It will become home to Centre for Business Growth, which unlocks the growth potential of Australia's small and medium enterprises, and the Ehrenberg-Bass Institute for Marketing Science, which grows global brands through evidence-based marketing.



The **UniSA Samsung SMARTSchool** is the state-of-the-art education and research hub developed to train aspiring teachers to become leaders in the tech ed space.



The SPACEschool is designed to break down the walls between what's learnt at university and the realities of the school classroom. The whole idea of the Samsung SMARTSchool is to give the opportunity to help our preservice teachers to have an absolutely optimal understanding of what goes on in a classroom.

There are special sessions on STEM and the role of technology. They'll still be very hands on, but what makes it cutting-edge is that you'll be able to watch it anywhere in Australia, or the world, so they'll be streaming in and streaming out of the class room.





MOD. at the University of South Australia is a futuristic museum of discovery, a place to be and be inspired.

With dynamic, changing exhibition programs, MOD. inspires young adults aged 15+ about science and technology, showcasing how research shapes our understanding of the world to inform the future.

For visitors, MOD. is a free science experience bringing together the general public, researchers, students and industry to interact, learn and be inspired. MOD. is Australia's boldest, and South Australia's only, interactive public science and creativity space. It features Australia's first Science on a Sphere, a room-sized display that shows planetary data on a sphere surrounded by touchscreens.

Located within UniSA's new Cancer Research Institute on North Terrace, MOD. is open Tues-Thurs 12-6pm, Fri 12-8pm and Sat-Sun 10-4pm. It is accessible to all members of the public, yet is recommended for ages 15 and above. https://mod.org.au/

Want to know how pilots react in an emergency? University of South Australia students will



have a cockpit view – literally – after taking delivery of a \$250,000 737 flight simulator. The simulator, based in the School of Engineering at UniSA's Mawson Lakes campus, will be used for research and training purposes relating to human factors safety management, advanced navigation and heavy aircraft systems. The simulator will be used for research into how factors like fatigue and decision making can affect pilots in a crisis. Technical skills are just one component of flying. We need to know more about how the mind and body reacts in an

emergency to reduce the likelihood of errors and accidents.






