Training on Now – Short Courses

Prepare to Drive - Obtain your Learners Permit (FSKRDG08) *LIMITED SPACES LEFT*

Looking to get your Learners Permit? This short course will prepare you with the skills and knowledge to obtain your Learner's Permit quickly and reduce your stress levels. This course is suitable for individuals who require support in reading and responding to visual and graphic texts. Instead of completing the Learner's Permit test with Service SA, you will complete your assessment with TAFE SA.

Your enrolment is not confirmed until you meet the prerequisites of the course.

Pre-requisites:

Minimum age 16. Participants are required to provide scanned copies of their green Medicare card AND at least (3) three original documents as evidence of identity 10 days prior to the start date. The 3 documents presented must together provide: full name; date of birth; current residential address; and signature. More information will be provided after submission of the online form. Original documents must be presented on the day of the workshop. Participants must have a good understanding of the English language and an ability to write and speak in English. Fee: *FREE * Fee free subject to eligibility. If ineligible, a fee of \$134.00 is payable. Participants will be advised of any fee payable on receipt of their application.

This delivery is offered under State Government funding subsidies. Eligible students must be an Australian Citizen/Permanent Resident, be 16 years of age or over and reside in an eligible regional location.

Provide First Aid (HLTAID003)

Provide First Aid (formerly Apply First Aid or Senior First Aid) is a comprehensive first aid course suitable for everyday emergency situations. This course is suitable for a senior first aider or person looking to gain skills in managing an unconscious patient, performing CPR, treating burns, wounds and bleeding, assisting someone who is choking, handling medical emergencies such as chest pain, asthma or anaphylaxis, reacting appropriately to someone who is in shock, and treating fractures and head, neck and spinal injuries. A first aid qualification should be renewed every three years. It is recommended that the CPR training is re-certified annually.

Our students are trained by current Paramedics who continue to work in their industries. This gives our students the advantage of learning from health professionals who have current experience in dealing with emergency situations. Maximum participant numbers apply. It is essential that participants book and pay course fee to confirm their place.

Chemical Card (AHCCHM303) & (AHCCHM304)

If you are applying pesticides or using agricultural chemicals in your business, this course will provide you with the skills and knowledge to prepare, apply, transport, handle and store chemicals. This course covers legislation, reading and understanding product labels, farm chemical formulations, personal safety, environmental safety, record keeping, risk assessment, integrated pest management and equipment calibration. To maintain current accreditation, re-accreditation is required every five years.

To undertake this course you must be able to read and interpret information on chemical labels and have a basic understanding of mathematics.

Fee: \$430 for students over the age of 16 and residing in rural and regional areas, subsidised through State Government funding. A further concession may be available with a current CITB card.

Chainsaw Operation and Maintenance (AHCMOM213)

Learn practical skills to operate and maintain a chainsaw. This short course will provide you with the training to operate and maintain a chainsaw when cross cutting fallen timber.

Students may bring their own chainsaws. Safety equipment supplied.

Children and Young People (formerly Child Safe Environments)

Anyone working with or providing services for Children in South Australia is a mandated notifier. This course provides information pertaining to the Children and Young People (Safety) Act 2017 and the associated obligations as a mandated notifier.

At the end of this training you will be able to:

- Identify situations or behaviours of concern that warrant reporting to the Department for Child Protection
- Demonstrate awareness of the Children and Young People (Safety) Act 2017 including the responsibilities of individuals, mandated notifiers and organisations who provide a service to children and young people
- Understand trauma related behaviours and indicators
- Consider appropriate ways to respond to disclosures of abuse
- Understand the process of reporting to the Child Abuse Report Line (CARL) and the elements of an effective notification.

Introduction to Wellbeing and Resilience (WAAGR, WAAGS & WAAGT)

This training will provide participants with a general understanding of the principles and practices of wellbeing and resilience, supported by positive psychology research.

The training will also encourage participants to consider how these principles and practices could be more widely applied – in the home, in the workplace, and in working with customers.

Wellbeing is the capacity for leading a flourishing life – as individuals, families, communities, and in our workplaces. The wellbeing toolkit offers the skills to meet the different challenges we all face, with the resources and supports we have available to us.

The training occurs over two full days, generally within a four week period:

- > Day 1 Introduction to key principles and practices
- > Learning by doing: Between day 1 and day 2, participants are encouraged to put into practice the skills learned during day 1
- > Day 2 Report back; wellbeing skills continued; next steps.

Fee: \$150.00 This delivery is offered under State Government funding subsidies. Eligible students must be an Australian Citizen/Permanent Resident, be 16 years of age or over and reside in an eligible regional location.

Licence to Operate a Forklift Truck (TLILIC2001)

This unit specifies the outcomes required for the operation of a powered industrial truck equipped with a mast and an elevating load carriage to which is attached a pair of fork arms or other attachment, for licensing purposes. This definition also includes a truck on which the operator is raised with the attachment for order-picking. This unit requires the operator to be able to plan the work, conduct routine checks on the forklift, shift loads in a safe manner

and shut down and secure the equipment after completion of operations. This unit is based on the National Standard for Licensing Persons Performing High Risk Work.

Fee: \$200 for students over the age of 16 and residing in rural and regional areas, subsidised through State Government funding. A further concession may be available with a current CITB card.
