GETTING HERE



Admission Pathways for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People

Whether you are a Year 12 student or a non-school leaver wanting to start or further your university studies there are a range of pathways to gain admission into Flinders including

Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR). If you have completed year 12 and received an ATAR you can apply directly through SATAC.

Indigenous Admissions Scheme (IAS). If you're unsure whether your ATAR will be enough, or if you are over 18 and a non-school leaver the IAS provides an alternative pathway into university.

Indigenous Entry Scheme into Medicine (IES) If you are keen to study medicine the IES can provide an alternative pathway to the GAMSET and includes online study to get you science ready and an intensive pre-medical program to help you prepare for the rigours of the program.

STAYING ENGAGED

Once you are here it is our promise that we will work hard to support you to achieve your learning goals and aspirations. How do we do this? By connecting you to the university community and providing a range of support services.

Yunggorendi Student Engagement provides a focal point for Indigenous students, encouraging and supporting students' participation and success in higher education Dedicated staff provide holistic support when you need it.

Orientation Program. Get a head start by joining other new Indigenous students enrolling for the first time. Learn university study skills, connect with peers and explore your cultural identity.

Yunggorendi Tutoring Program. Free supplementary tuition to help you to be the best student you can be and achieve your study goals.

Scholarships. Financial support and assistance to meet accommodation, education and living costs.

Cadetships and Internships. Tap into the many cadetship and internship opportunities available to get paid work experience while you learn.

Culturally safe space. Yunggorendi Mande is our home and our shelter which we share with you to provide a space where you can study, relax or just hang out 24/7. It includes a computer lab, lounge, study desks and tutoring rooms.

Want to live on campus? Flinders is the only university in Adelaide that gives you the opportunity to live on campus with accommodation for over 550 students at the University Hall and Deidre Jordan Village.

Future career prospects. Indigenous graduates are highly sought after and Yunggorendi has the right connections to support you in finding the right graduate job for you.
