The Youth Opportunities Scholarship is open to graduates of the Youth Opportunities program. Scholarships are aimed at helping students reach their potential, through assistance towards goals and future career plans. Scholarships are awarded up to the value of \$1,500 and include ongoing coaching.

Applicants must be able to demonstrate financial need: please see overleaf for details of what this involves. Students who have shown continued effort and progress towards their goals, who show Personal Leadership, and those who face hardship will be given precedence.

Graduates can apply for a scholarship in **one or more** of the following categories:

- 1. Academic tutoring
- 2. Career guidance
- 3. Financial support

All scholarship awardees are also contacted on a regular basis (approximately twice per term) and provided ongoing coaching, goal-setting and strategy support by Youth Opportunities Trainers.

Students who wish to apply must approach a teacher at their school to act as a referee, supporting the student's application. There is a one-page section for the referee to complete once the student and parent/guardian sections are complete.

Scholarship applications for Term 3 are due by Monday 9th September 2019.

FAQ Frequently Asked Questions



1. What does financial need mean? What is proof of financial need?

Our scholarships are aimed at students who are facing financial or other types of disadvantage, allowing them opportunities they wouldn't otherwise be able to access. You may be eligible to apply if:

- you are eligible to receive the school cards benefit. If you are, then your family's financial situation has already been assessed by the SA Government.
- you or your family are in receipt of a health care card or benefit from Centrelink including (but not limited to) Youth Allowance, Austudy, Abstudy or a pension. If you are in receipt of a Centrelink benefit, your family's financial situation has already been assessed by Centrelink.
- you are not eligible for either of the above but you and/or your family are still struggling. If this is the case, you need to explain your circumstances so that we can assess the need for a Scholarship.

Proof of financial need includes copies of relevant cards (i.e. Centrelink health care card) or letters confirming your eligibility/receipt of benefits (i.e. School card eligibility letter). If you are not in receipt of a benefit, then a written statements and proof of income can be attached to your application. The more information you can provide, the better we are able to assess your level of need.

2. Why do you need my latest school report?

We want to ensure we reward applicants who are putting their best efforts into their schoolwork. This does not mean you need to be a straight A student though. We may also request another report in the future to determine if the scholarship has helped to maintain or improve your grades.

3. What kind of supporting documents should I attach?

Anything that supports your application and shows motivation, skill development, achievement, community service and determination to achieve your goals. This may include (but is not limited to) certificates, awards, newspaper articles, written references and copies of work.

4. What if my requested opportunity/item isn't available?

In the instance that what you have requested is not available or possible (e.g. there is no tutor in the subject you have requested) we will work with you to find an alternative opportunity that still supports you towards your academic and career goals.

5. When will I be informed if I have been successful in my application?

All applicants (successful and unsuccessful) will be informed via text message and email by **Wednesday** 9th October 2019.

6. If I am successful, when will I receive my Scholarship?

Scholarships will be rolled out over the course of Term 4; timing may vary depending on what is awarded. We will hold a presentation ceremony where most scholarships will be awarded and may also present at school assemblies. We will keep you informed.

7. Can I re-apply?

All applicants are welcome to re-apply, Scholarship applications are open in Term 1 and 3 each year. Previous scholarship winners are encouraged to re-apply for additional scholarships once per year until the end of tertiary education.
