To sit the STAT Multiple Choice

- If you intend to submit a SATAC application for an undergraduate course, you will apply for the STAT at the same time as you complete your SATAC application. Follow the instructions on the screen as you apply.
- 2. If you have already submitted a SATAC application for an undergraduate course and you now wish to apply for a STAT sitting, you can do so online. Log in via My Application, then select 'Book or change STAT' from the options provided.
- 3. If you have already submitted a SATAC application for a higher education course offered by TAFE SA and you now wish to apply for a STAT sitting you should <u>contact SATAC</u> for assistance.

For courses starting in 2020, the fee for **STAT Multiple Choice is \$150.00** if you submit your application between 5 August and 31 October 2019 and pay your STAT fee in this time. The fee increases to \$235.00 for applications submitted between 1 November 2019 and 31 March 2020, and for any applicant who pays their STAT fee after 31 October.

What will I need to bring to the STAT test?

You will need current photo identification with an embedded signature and date of birth (such as a driver's licence or passport), your STAT Authority to Sit letter, 2 pencils (B, HB or 2B), a pencil sharpener and an eraser.

Calculators, highlighters, dictionaries, rulers, mobile phones and pagers are not permitted.

You must present your physical identification document as digital licences or other digital identification cards are not acceptable.

How will my STAT result be reported?

STAT scores are reported on an approximate range of 100 to 200, with a mean of 150. Scores are not represented as a percentage and there is no pass or fail score for STAT. Rather, the STAT score scale reflects the differing abilities of candidates and the different degrees of difficulty of the test items. STAT scores are intended to provide a relative estimate of a candidate's ability compared to other potential or past applicants.

Your STAT results will be recorded on your SATAC application and used according to undergraduate selection rules.

How will I be told about my STAT result?

SATAC will email your results to you as soon as they are received from the Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER).

How long is will my STAT score be valid?

There is no formal limit on the length of time a STAT score remains valid for applications through SATAC. Some interstate tertiary institutions may impose their own limits, so you should check with the tertiary admissions centre or institution to which you apply.
